In 1981 I established a private practice. Full time responsibilities include the provision of individual, marital, and family counseling services. I have involvement on a contractual basis with the Veteran's Administration, NE State Employee Assistance Program, Grand Island Physical Therapy Return to Work Program, Social Security Administration, NE Department of Health & Human Services, private attorneys, and the U.S. Department of Justice.

I am credentialed as a Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor and Job Placement Specialist with NE Workers' Compensation Court. I maintain certification as a Fellow of the American Board of Vocational Experts and maintain a license as an RN and a Licensed Mental Health Practitioner.

My professional activities include: direct client counseling, ongoing case management, out-patient contact, life care planning, coordination of medical services after discharge, vocational testing and analysis. Additionally I evaluate restrictions in the job placement process and perform follow-up. My credentials allow me to utilize a multi-faceted approach.
